Motown Mission: June 22nd - July 1st (Incoming 9th - Outgoing 12th grade)

Cost:

The cost of the Motown Mission Trip is **\$375**. There will only be 25 spots available for this trip; first come, first serve. To reserve your spot please submit a completed Mission Trip Application and Deposit of **\$100 by Sunday October 29th**. The second payment of **\$137.50 is due on Sunday, February 11th**. The final payment of **\$137.50** must be received no later than **Sunday, June 10th**.

Motown Mission:

Motown Mission is an urban work mission destination in Detroit, MI for Christian youth, college, and adult groups interested in economic disaster recovery work in the name of Jesus Christ. Deeply rooted in Wesleyan Theology, Motown Mission began as a United Methodist organization and continues to maintain the connection to the contemporary UMC's commitment to grace, mission, and service as a means for individual and communal transformation.

History:

The Motown Mission Experience began in 2005 as a one week trip for Middle School students from Birmingham First UMC. Since then it has grown under the umbrella of the Young Leaders Initiative and with ongoing support from the United Methodist Union of Greater Detroit and individual donors. As of Summer 2016 Motown Mission has welcomed over 3,500 young people to Detroit, Michigan and has put over \$2 Million worth of volunteer hours and monetary contributions in this city!

Theology:

As a United Methodist related organization Motown Mission seeks to connect young people to Wesleyan principles of faith in God, and service as a means of grace. So, each week we create opportunities for teams to help the people in the city (social holiness) fight poverty and other effects of the economic crisis. Then, with moments of prayer and reflection we help teams explore how God is changing lives and transforming hearts (personal holiness). Motown Mission welcomes participants from any and all Christian traditions interested in doing no harm, learning how to do good, and practicing staying in love with God.

Impact:

Over the years Motown Mission has helped over **3,500 participants** from **200 churches** offer **95,000 hours** of volunteer work to the people of the City of Detroit. In total the value of this time and material now add up to over **\$2 Million worth of service to this city in the name of Jesus Christ**.

Projects:

All groups will be engaged in economic disaster recovery work projects. Motown Mission partners with home repair agencies in the Joy-Southfield, Brightmoor, and Wyoming-Plymouth neighborhoods of Detroit, MI. These partners prepare lists of work projects, home owners, and other volunteers that we partner with for work projects. Other partner organizations include feeding and greening ministries like the NOAH Project, Michigan Urban Farming Initiative, and more. Motown Mission works with each

group to match your skill level and interests with appropriate projects. More intensive home repair/construction projects are reserved for older or more experienced groups.

Transportation:

For this trip we will use 15-passenger vans, rental vehicles, or possible volunteer vehicles from families. There will ALWAYS be two adults legally eligible to drive in each vehicle. Drivers will undergo a driver history report and background check before attending any youth mission trips.

Lodging:

Motown Mission accommodations for large groups in the summertime are at **Metropolitan UMC** in the New Center Area of Detroit. We use a number of Sunday School rooms there as dormitories. We have access to about 70 bunk-beds, and space to accommodate an additional 50-60 participants with air mattresses and cots. Participants who would like to bring their own air mattresses or cots are invited to do so. Guys and girls are placed in separate classrooms and we try to accommodate each group to have their own sleeping quarters. Showers are in the basement by the gymnasium and are individual stalls.

Food:

All meals are included in the **\$300/person** cost (Sunday Dinner - through Saturday breakfast) except dinner on your half work day. Lunches are made and bagged in the mornings and taken to the work sites, and dinners are cooked and provided by Motown Mission staff and/or volunteers from supporting churches.

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RULES & EXPECTATIONS

The **Motown Mission (MM) staff have overall responsibility for all activities.** Directions given by MM staff are to be strictly observed.

Adult Leaders are responsible for their youth volunteers at all times while your group participates with MM. This includes enforcing all the expectations, rules, and guidelines of MM.

MM's youth program is **designed for students who have completed 6th - 12th grade.** Heavy construction work will be reserved for High School students and older. Groups with younger participants only will be given projects according to the skills you report. *PLEASE NOTE: No infants, toddlers, or any youth under the age of 11 are permitted on a Motown Mission trip.*

MME and participants will follow a "minimum two Adult Leader rule" in all of the following situations during the week of MME:

- 2 adult leaders of the same gender as the youth participants in every room at the accommodation site.
- 2 adult leaders with every work team
- 2 adult leaders with any group during Detroit cultural excursions and evening activities

A minimum adult to youth ratio must be met for youth program weeks. Motown Mission requires youth teams to abide by safe sanctuary policies, which state that an adult counselor is to be four years older than the oldest youth you'll have with you. Adult ratios to youth must not be lower than one caregiver for every seven 11-13 year olds; one caregiver for every eight 14-17 year olds. If you are bringing an "adult" that does not meet the "four years older than the oldest youth" rule, they can attend, but must not be considered part of your minimum adult ratio.

MM requires all volunteers over the age of 18 to be background checked by the church / organization they come with. Motown Mission abides by safe sanctuary policies, and can provide examples of background check forms for you to use. Each group must sign off on the completion of these background checks before arriving at MM.

Please **use tools, materials, and resources responsibly** while participating at Motown Mission.

Possession or use of illegal drugs or alcohol is not permitted at any time during MM. Participants, youth or adults, choosing to break this rule will be asked to return home immediately at their own expense.

MM staff will inform each group of any **project site or accommodation site specific guidelines** prior to your arrival.

Smoking or use of tobacco products is prohibited inside any MM accommodation site or at any work project site. If needed, a designated area will be identified for legal adults.

No pets are permitted at the MM accommodation site. If a new pet is acquired during the week, arrange to retrieve the pet on your way home.

To ensure **privacy of all participants**, no females are permitted at any time in the males' sleeping area. Likewise, males are not permitted in the females' sleeping area at any time.

Quiet hours will be established and followed by all participants at accommodation sites. Some exceptions to set hours will be made when special evening activities occur.

Appropriate attire will be worn at both the accommodation site and work site. This includes not wearing clothing with offensive language, clothing that is overly revealing, or clothing that is inappropriate for the expected work.

All volunteers (youth and adults) are expected to participate fully in the program of MM. Adults will have the opportunity daily to check in with MM staff to handle any situations that may need attention and to ensure that the week is going as best it can.

Participants will be asked to **help in chores** (meal prep, clean up, etc) around the accommodation site to make that run smoothly and efficiently.

Each work crew (6-12 people max) must provide their own transportation to and from their work site. It is recommended that each work crew have their own van. **2 adults must be present with each work crew at all times** except if one adult needs to care for an emergency.

Working hours are approximately 9am to 4pm normal weekdays and 9am to 1pm on half-days. Groups are encouraged to visit cultural centers of Detroit on half-day afternoons before returning to the accommodations site. **Dinner on half-day is not provided by Motown Mission, this allows groups to have dinner at the restaurant of their choice** or to cook dinner at Metropolitan UMC at their own expense.

We expect lunch to be eaten at the work site. This is an important opportunity to get to know the people you are serving. MM will provide brown bag lunches for groups.

MM asks that **participants refrain from using cell phones and portable electronic devices** at work sites.

Firearms, air rifles or pistols, BB guns, replicas of firearms or any kind of **weaponry (or replicas) are not permitted at MM.** Adults who have professional license to carry weapons are asked refrain from exercising that practice while at Motown Mission.

DenUM Mission: July 16th – 20th (Incoming 7th - Outgoing 8th grade)

Cost:

The cost of the DenUM Mission Trip is **\$130**. This covers meals, a free day, urban education, and supplies. There will only be 15 spots available for this trip; first come, first serve. To reserve your spot please submit a completed Mission Trip Application and Deposit of **\$25** by **Sunday October 29th**. Final Payment of **\$105** will be due on **Sunday July 8th**.

DenUM:

Since 1983 Denver Urban Ministries has committed to providing hands-on educational and service opportunities to youth and adults interested in improving the Denver community and taking the knowledge learned here, back to their own communities. We take pride in our strong relationships with local non-profits and churches and the continued relationships with youth programs and colleges throughout the country. Historically a United Methodist affiliated organization we believe in providing all communities of faith a chance to serve and put their faith into action. Prior to our 2018 mission trip, DenUM will be merging with the St. Francis Center in Denver. This should not interfere with our trip, but we may need to be flexible as they complete this merge process.

Urban Education:

Denver Urban Ministries is a non-profit crisis center located in central Denver. For 30 years their commitment to service, education and advocacy has improved the lives of countless individuals and families by providing day and weeklong volunteers to over 20 non-profit organizations in the Denver metro area.

Projects:

Working with DenUM can consist of a variety of projects. Students may spend the morning taking a group of low income children to the roller skating rink, sorting donations at a food/clothing bank, distributing fresh produce to low income and homeless families, serving a meal, painting a home, or sharing conversation with older adults at a retirement community. DenUM also provides an education program during this week to help students connect with the deeper issues of homelessness and poverty.

Transportation:

For this trip we will use 15-passenger vans, rental vehicles, or possible volunteer vehicles from families. There will ALWAYS be two adults legally eligible to drive in each vehicle. Drivers will undergo a driver history report and background check before attending any youth mission trips.

Housing:

During this week DenUM arranges for us to stay at a local United Methodist Church. Most facilities provide the use of a kitchen. Some facilities have on-site showers, but there is always the possibility that we will shower at a local swimming pool or fitness complex. All host facilities are safe and secure.

Food:

During the DenUM mission trip we provide and prepare all of our own food. It is likely we will also eat out for some meals. More information will be available as we get closer.

Tentative DenUM Mission Packing List:

Here is a suggested list of items to bring on your Urban Plunge trip to Denver.

- Bible, journal, and a pen (Please don't forget these)
- Pants/Shorts (3-4 pairs, at least one pair of pants)
- Shirts (3-4 YGA* shirts)
- Underwear & Socks (for EACH day)
- PJs (Also YGA)
- Running or tennis shoes
- Shower shoes/sandals
- Sunscreen & bug repellent
- Necessary Medicines: prescriptions, antibiotics, vitamins, aspirin, allergy tabs, etc.
- Snacks to share with the group
- Sleeping bag & pillow
- Sleeping pad or air mattress
- Flashlight/headlamp
- Toiletries (Soap, Shampoo, Deodorant, Toothbrush, Toothpaste, etc.)
- Bath Towel & washcloth
- **Water bottle (DO NOT FORGET THIS)**
- Hat/ bandana and sunglasses for outside activities
- Camera
- Electronics (you may bring electronics, *but you will RARELY IF EVER be able to use them during the trip*)
- Work clothes to get dirty in! (Think paint clothes)
- Swimsuit (for showers)
- Personal items
- **Spending money (\$25-40 for one breakfast, one lunch, and snacks/shopping)**

Bring a flexible attitude! This will be the key to a positive week. The Plunge Coordinator will do her best to notify you prior to any changes that may occur, but agency needs, emergencies, schedules, and resources can change at the last minute.

Please be flexible and things will be a lot more fun!

Work Site Dress Code: For the safety of all participants, the dress attire for ALL work sites forbids spaghetti-strap tank tops, tube tops, anything which shows your stomach or bottom (high shirts or low pants), short shorts (including Softe cheer shorts), or sandals.

Recommended daily attire: denim/ athletic pants or shorts, loose t-shirt, and tennis shoes.

Personal items can be store at the church throughout the week. However, DenUM and the Urban Education Program are not responsible for any lost or stolen items. Ipods, smart phones and personal gaming systems should be left at the church or in a vehicle while you are volunteering.

Tentative DenUM Sample Schedule:

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Each group's itinerary is designed based on the day and time of arrival and the length of the stay.

Day 1 (Monday):

Welcome to Denver! The Urban Education Coordinator will meet us at our host church for orientation to the Urban Education Program and to review the week's itinerary, tour the host church, and give a briefing on the issues of poverty and homelessness in Denver. It is also likely we will work with our first non-profit organization during this first afternoon.

Day 2, 3, and 5 (Tuesday, Wednesday, and ½ Friday):

7:00 am - Rise and Shine, it is time to work! Groups will volunteer at any of the 20+ local nonprofits partners. If our group is larger than 10, it is possible we will be split into different work teams during the day and require separate transportation. Usually, what one group does one day, another group will do later. This way all participants get similar experiences. Two adults will always accompany a work team.

8:30 am – Arrive at the worksites. Traveling directions, worksite expectations, and contact information are provided by DenUM. Worksites include, but are not limited to: preparing and serving meals for the homeless; sorting and packing donations in a food bank; building or improving low-income housing; painting homes, nurturing and tending gardens and working with children of economically disadvantaged families, individuals with disabilities and the elderly.

12:00 pm - Lunchtime! We will bring our own sack lunches to the worksites. Then it is back to work!

4:00-7:00 pm - Relaxation time! A couple of the afternoons may be set aside for educational activities such as a Downtown Walking Tour or the Game of Life. Other afternoons are free allowing time to explore the city of Denver, take a nap or shower. This is a great time for our group to discuss their experiences in Denver and reflect on the bigger social issues.

7:30 pm - One evening will be devoted to a discussion with someone who has experienced homelessness first hand.

9:30 pm - Bed Time! After all the adventures of the day, our group will gather for evening devotions. This is a great time to reflect on what the impact of serving is having on your personal and spiritual lives.

NOTE: The second half of Friday will include cleaning, packing up, and our return trip to Monument.

Day 3 (Thursday):

Free Day! Get out and explore all Denver and Colorado have to offer! This will include educational and fun activities such as a tour of the Colorado State Capital, dinner on the 16th Street Mall, and maybe even a Rockies Game!

Purpose

This covenant is a commitment that you are making to God, Tri-Lakes United Methodist Church, your youth leaders, and your fellow youth in order that our trip/event may be a good experience for all. Every trip/event we participate in should reflect what we understand the Christian life to be. In some ways many of these “rules” are already implied, but they are listed as a reminder that Christianity looks different.

Going on a trip with the Youth Department at Tri-Lakes United Methodist Church should be viewed as a gift. It is not to be abused. Participants ought to be encouraged to grow in their faith throughout the trip/event. If you breach the confidence of any of the following items the staff member(s) of Tri-Lakes United Methodist Church reserve the right to send you home. This is not to come across as heavy-handed but rather to demonstrate the integrity of this ministry. There are standards and expectations which we follow as we grow in our love for God and each other. By signing this document, you agree to be held accountable to these standards. You also take responsibility for any financial liabilities incurred as a result of poor behavior.

Youth Covenant:

I acknowledge and accept that community life at a Tri-Lakes United Methodist Church sponsored trip/event is based upon mutual trust, respect for God, myself, and others. In addition to this, I acknowledge and commit to adhere to the standards and expectations set by the leadership of this trip/event.

Standards/Expectations:

- The use or possession of alcohol, illegal drugs is prohibited
- The use or possession of tobacco in any form is prohibited. Lighters are also not appropriate on youth events.
- The use or possession of any weapon is prohibited (A **small** pocket knife may be allowed, but the Director of Youth Ministry must be informed and approve. Large knives will be taken until the end of the trip/event).
- Riding in or driving a motor vehicle without specific permission from the Director of Youth Ministry or another responsible adult youth leader is prohibited
- Participants are expected to remain on the property we are visiting during the time we are scheduled to be there.
- Sexual behavior, be it implied, consensual, or verbal is not acceptable.
- Inappropriate language and gestures will not be used
