

A great way to frame your submissions is to ponder the question, "where have I seen or experienced God in my areas of involvement?" and to document those stories for our entire church to read. We look forward to hearing what you've been up to!

Kitchen Korner

I am Chris Weber and I am the Kitchen Manager for the church. It is my responsibility to organize the kitchen space for church use, care for the appliances, general cleanliness and purchasing.

Guidelines For Kitchen Use:

- **I.** We have many groups that utilize the kitchens and each group is responsible for leaving the kitchens clean and ready for the next group. There is no one that will clean up after you. Please attend to the following after use:
 - **a.** Wash, dry and put away all non-disposable and disposable items. Don't leave for the next group to attend to. It's easier for me to evaluate what I need to purchase if all paper products are returned to proper cabinets. Cabinets are labeled.
 - **b.** Wipe down all counter tops and tables used.
 - c. Sweep up large food crumbs on the floors. Brooms are provided.
 - **d.** Place all airpots used in their proper cabinet. Leaving them out on counters leads to falls and breakage.
 - **e.** Do not leave leftover food in refrigerators unless you are leaving it for a group that you have talked to. Food left in refrigerator without a label is free for anyone to use. I dispose of unlabeled/outdated items once a month.
 - **f.** Turn off the coffee machine in the basement kitchen after use. Leave the upstairs units "on" at all times. Machines are labeled as such.
 - **g.** Refill condiment caddy with sugar, creamers, hot chocolate, etc. as needed. Re-supply is above and below coffee machine in lower level kitchen.
 - **h.** Place all dirty linen in hampers. Extra clean linen is stored in Cabinet #2, bottom shelf upstairs.
 - i. Please leave ice scoop on top of Lower Level ice machine. Leaving it in the machine causes dirty hands to go looking for it! This scoop has a guard to keep dirty hands from contaminating the ice. Machine is cleaned annually.
 - **j.** If you use linen tablecloths, don't put them in hampers. Take them home and wash and return to storage rack.
 - k. Please return any items you borrowed from upstairs kitchen or vice versa.
 - **I.** These guidelines are posted in the kitchens.

II. New Updates:

a. There are now paper rectangular tablecloths in both kitchens for the six-foot white folding tables. Please use these for serving tables if you prefer not to wash tablecloths. They are in cabinet #2 bottom shelf in upstairs kitchen. In lower level kitchen look in cabinet above sink to left of the paper towel cabinet.

- b. Please don't purchase any more ketchup, mustard or mayonnaise. Please use up what we have. We have 2 large pump containers of ketchup and mayonnaise that we need to use up.
- c. We now have 2 chafing dishes. Chafing fuel is provided.
- **d.** Please don't donate kitchen items without notifying me first.
- e. There are 2-3 utensil caddies stored with the supply of plastic utensils upstairs and downstairs. Please use them. Please don't use expensive insulated coffee cups to put utensils in. If you need something smaller please use cold cups instead.

The Art Committee endeavors to augment the teaching and preaching aspects of worship through visual elements and displays. Although we think we are trying to enhance your worship experience, we often find ourselves blessed. For example, when creating the display for the current sermon series regarding the fruit of the spirit, we saw the humor of the great room tree (before we added leaves), a bare tree producing fruit! Yet, Jesus often spoke of bearing fruit through cultivating the Word, through righteousness, and other parables. We were also immediately



struck with the realization that in our bare lives, God can and does work miracles! What a delightful moment in our preparations.

While Art Committee continues to add to your worship experience, you can help us by continuing to "sponsor" the Sunday services' flowers. The sign up for sponsorship (a \$25) donation) in honor or memory of someone or some occasion is in the great room. This year's monies are for art committee supplies and projects. Through your sponsorships and donations, art committee added a crosses display for Lenten worship, donated to the cost of the new Yamaha baby grand piano, updated the office décor, assisted with the Fall Kickoff fellowship, etc. On average, donations total \$300-\$500, but if 40 weeks received sponsorship, the year's total would increase to \$1,000! That would certainly help with the new Prayer Wall project! We appreciate all your help and knowing how the visual arts elements add to your worship experience.


The UMM will have their monthly meeting on November 17th.

Finance Update


2018 3rd Quarter Financial Results

Your donations of \$562,917 to the General Fund in the first nine months of 2018 were less than the expenditures of \$595,166, yet in line with giving patterns from prior years. Consequently, the church's cash position declined during the first nine months, but remains very strong. Thank you for your continued financial support of TLUMC.
