As president of the United Methodist Men (UMM) I lead the men of TLUMC in service to our congregation. We meet the third Saturday of each month for prayer, Bible study, and breakfast. Vision Team Update

Earlier this month, TLUMC Church Council ap proved a new Vision for our church; charting the course toward our future: Theologically Traditional, Personally Transformational, Outwardly Missional. The Vision Team appreciates your diligent survey responses and thoughtful focus group comments over the past 9 months. The church-wide 52% response rate represents a clear indicator that TLUMC people

have a strong sense of ownership in our church and its future. Church Council intends to conduct an implementation planning session in the April/May timeframe, and Pastor Bob is preparing a sermon series for Autumn 2019 to dig into the meaning of our TLUMC Vision.

Theologically Traditional means we affirm the authority of Scripture, using the Bible as the authoritative source for our life and faith and believe that it contains all things necessary for salvation; confess "the faith once delivered to the saints" (Jude 3), drawing our essential theological, doctrinal, and ethical convictions from the Scriptures and the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds; with a distinctively Methodist perspective, in our expression of faith, practice, and discipline.

Personally Transformational means we pursue holiness of heart and life, through the means of grace, especially by watching over one another in love through involvement in small groups. We believe that every Christian is called by God through the power of the Holy Spirit to journey toward holiness. We understand holiness as extravagant love for God, sacrificial love of neighbor, and freedom from the

power of sin. This transformation is inwardly experienced and outwardly demonstrated. A Christian grows in holiness by attending regularly to the means of grace: searching, reading, meditating, and studying the Scriptures; prayer; fasting; attending worship; partaking of Holy Communion; and participation in Christian community. Transformation takes place most effectively when Christians meet in small groups designed for support, encouragement, help in overcoming sin, and instruction in the life of holiness.

Outwardly Missional means we seek to "do all the good we can to the bodies and souls of people;" through acts of compassion, service, and justice; for all people (especially the marginalized) locally, regionally, nationally, and internationally. While we believe we are saved by God's grace alone, we also believe we are saved for God's mission in the world (Eph 2.8-10). We do good works for others so that they may experience the comprehensive salvation of God: relational, physical, and spiritual wholeness. Jesus commanded us to pray that God's Kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven; thus, we work for what we pray for. We work for individual and social transformation so that when the Kingdom of God comes in its fullness it is not a culture shock. We take seriously Jesus' Great Commission (Matt 28.18-20) and follow an Acts 1.8 model for missions, seeing the world as our parish. Our mission field is Jerusalem (Monument/Tri-Lakes area), Judea (Pikes Peak Region), Samaria (the socially outcast), and the ends of the earth (the US and beyond).

We appreciate your patience during this transition.




